by roping off, etc.

Absorb spilled material in dry sand or inert absorbent before recovering it into an airtight container. In case of large amount of spillage, contain a spill by bunding. Adhered or collected material should be promptly disposed of, in

in case of a fire. Use spark-proof tools and explosion-proof equipment.
